- (7) The Council shall, in addition to the powers specified in this section, enjoy such further additional powers in respect of public roads and streets within Belize City as are conferred upon it by or under the Public Roads Act, Cap. 232.
- **25.**—(1) Without prejudice to any other powers conferred on the Council by this Act or any other law, the Council shall have the power and responsibility of co-ordinating the activities and operations of all utility agencies and property developers within Belize City with respect to the excavation and restoration of streets, canals, creeks and other public rights of way, with the object of preventing damage to the city infrastructure and minimising the disruption of utility services to Belize City.
- (2) Where any damage or injury to the infrastructure of Belize City is caused by a utility agency or the Council in the excavation and restoration of any public road, street, canal, creek and other public right of way, the Council shall be responsible, subject to subsection (3) of this section, to make good such damage or injury and to restore the infrastructure to a good state of general repair.
