## <u>Chief Justice, Hon Mde. Louise Esther Blenman Delivers Keynote Speech at</u> the Ceremony for the Presentation of Graduates of Hugh Wooding Law School

This graduation ceremony marked a significant milestone for the two hundred and thirteen (213) graduates, many of whom are set to embark on legal careers throughout the Caribbean and beyond.
